1. <u>Declaration of Quorum:</u> Chairman Bockoski declared a quorum.

Chairman Bockoski explained that the BZA is a quasi-judicial branch of the local government. Will be discussing items on the docket with issues and stipulations considered for each docket. All comments and questions should be addressed to the Board and its members as opposed to the petitioner or others in audience. Attendants must sign in if intending to speak tonight. Each speaker must state name and address for the record when you approach the podium. Visits are limited to three minutes. Each item listed on the docket typically has a portion set aside for public hearing, again limit to three minutes, if a person wishing to speak agrees with someone that has already spoken it is not necessary to repeat those comments in entirety. It is only necessary to agree with the comments and move on in interest of time. All motions are made in the affirmative, that does not mean it is the way we will vote.

Mr. Zawadzki requested the petitioner, Indiana National Guard, be tabled until next month, that meeting would be November 20, 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall due to a notification issue. Chairman Bockoski stated we need to vote on that, will read the docket numbers for the record. BZA-1025-47-C1, BZA 1025-48-C1, BZA-1025-49-C1, BZA-1025-50-C1, BZA-1025-51-C1 are dockets, looking for a motion to table.

Mr. Zell made motion to table the dockets listed above. Mr. Thomas second. All present in favor.

Delanie Owen 1240 Stringtown Pike, Cicero. We have a shed on our property and wanting permission to leave where it is. Neighbors shed is on the line, there is not 25 feet, not wanting neighbors to move theirs but want to leave ours as is. Mr. Zell questioned if it was a new shed. Mrs. Owen relocated shed from 29 Point Lane, didn't realize had to get approval. Neighbor reported due to issues with previous homeowner; after meeting us was ok with leaving but we have to get approval. Mrs. Owen described how it was moved to the location. Discussion ensued regarding the property layout. Mr. Zell stated it is probably the best example of practical difficulty. Chairman Bockoski stated his concern is, if you had a dock and there was a fire, could a fire hose get down through the property past the sheds. Mrs. Owen stated yes it could, from the north side of the house. Mr. Berry clarified the shed size being 12 feet wide. Mrs. Owen stated yes, and side is 25 wide. She added the old ordinance would be ok at three feet off the line. Came to realize the old shed was ok and was grandfathered in. Discussion on neighbors' garage and shed placement as well as trees in the area using the monitor to assist. Mrs. Owen expressed concern also for placement and aesthetics for the neighbors. Chairman Bockoski asked for motion to open to the public stating will be discussing both together and voting separately.

Mr. Zell made a motion to open to public on the two dockets. Mr. Thomas second. All present in favor. No public comments.

Mr. Zell made motion to close public hearing. Mr. Thomas second. All present in favor.

Chairman Bockoski questioned the first docket is for the three-foot setback and the second is for it to be on the property line. Mr. Zawadzki clarified the second one is down at the lakeside, they want to build a deck with stairs. The stairs would be what would most encroach. Does cross into the Citizens easement, the 20 foot. Mr. Zell verified no issue with utilities. Mr. Zawadzki stated they were notified and did not respond. Chairman Bockoski questioned if any conditions needed to attach.

Mr. Zell made a motion to approve BZA-1025-39-R3 as presented. Mr. Berry second.

A Special Exception Use request application has been submitted for the property located at 770 South Peru Street, Cicero IN, 46034 concerning Article 4.1 of the Cicero/Jackson Township Zoning Ordinance in order to: allow a restaurant with outdoor seating, which is a Special Exception Use for the "NC" Neighborhood Commercial district.

Troy Reed 10166 Holly Berry Circle Fishers, IN and Wendee Gilbert 10166 Holly Berry Circle, Fishers. Mr. Reed stated to explain the petitions, explained how they got here. In 2019 had warehouse in Indy where summer sausages and snacks were made, approximately 50% were wholesale. In 2022, became a certified to sell wholesale out of state. Over the years, we have decided to develop retail side. Are asking for is to continue salami and summer sausages and snacks to be made on site. While manufacturing it is not pigs on site, product brought in and we turn it into our sausages same as a butcher shop does. We would have breakfast, pastries with expressos, etc., Italian sandwiches at lunch, and woodfire pizza in the evening. In addition, we would be operating a grocery for Italian products, sell our sausages etc., same product we use on our sandwiches and pizzas. This is what makes it a manufacturing business. Not distribute to others. Chairman Bockoski stated what it sounds like you are describing is a sandwich shop-60% of the description. Mr. Reed explained where they get their products. Have done farmers markets continually, also make our own bread. Chairman Bockoski stated to do this you need storage units on the property. Mr. Reed stated walk-in cooler. Currently there are two buildings on the property, the barbershop and our portion. Potentially the barbershop could move to another location in a year or two and we take over building 30 if successful. We have 1400 square feet space coming from a 4000 square foot space. We still need coolers; monitor was used to indicate the spaces. Two additions 10x30, that are used for the manufacturing of the meat.



Building A is where grinding etc. happens, building B used for packaging. Mr. Reed explained the equipment that would be used for packaging. Mr. Thomas questioned the shipping container. Mr. Reed explained it is housing equipment temporarily and would be moved off site. Mr. Zell expressed concern for smell, noise, waste, neighbors how do you address those type of items. Mr. Reed no odors to speak of, we have a smoker, but it is used as an oven, waste is like any restaurant and sprayed down to prevent animals wanting to eat. Noise the most would be compressors almost whisper quiet. Mr. Massonne questioned if each freezer/cooler would have a compressor. Mr. Reed stated yes. Mr. Zell questioned where the dumpster would be located. Monitor used to explained positioning-dotted line on the picture, fenced in with gate, once the containers are removed. Mr. Massonne questioned if it is good on parking. Mr. Zawadzki stated they currently have a parking variance from previous tenant that it is still in effect. There are several variances still in effect, signage is one that is still in effect. Several Land Use that are not in effect. But parking is still in effect. Mr. Culp added that the parking variance was tied to the property not the business. Mr. Zell questioned if the Plan Commission will be seeing. Mr. Zawadzki stated they will do an Aesthetic Review. Mr. Zell questioned if all approvals are granted, when would you start this business, no later than? Mr. Reed answered before the first of year. Mr. Berry questioned the hours and days of operation. Mr. Reed answered 7am-7pm, M-F with Saturday to be determined probably 9-2. No Sunday's and closed major Holidays. Mr. Reed discussing the second variance, we do not have seating inside, it is carryout only. What we are asking for is a deck out front with four tables potentially 20 seats, to be built next spring. Mr. Zawadzki used monitor to indicate approximate space for deck area. Located in the front of the building. Mr. Massonne stated he thought it was a great opportunity for the town and cooler is interesting, the outdoor seating is good addition. Concern is concealing the cooler. Mr. Zell agreed it is a good fit for town of Cicero. Mr. Reed added were one of three in state of Indiana. Mr. Reed added the feedback at farmers markets has been positive and will make the drive. Mr. Zell asked about employment opportunities. Mr. Reed explained approximately 8-12. Mr. Zell stated he sees parking as a challenge. Mr. Reed replied to beer and wine comment that have been approved for carryout only on beer and wine. Chairman Bockoski asked what would be future plan for facility? Mr. Reed stated a bakery, with Italian pastries, and ice cream.

Mr. Massonne made motion to open to the public. Mr. Zell second. All present in favor.

Melody Landes 709 S. Peru St. Cicero. Questioned what are the variances for parking on his lot and variances for parking on St. Rd 19? Mr. Zawadzki answered the variance is for: to allow street parking is the most lenient, to not go by these standards and allow street parking. Typically, we do not allow street parking to count towards the required number of spaces, but that variance allows it. Ms. Landes asked to get a copy of the variance. Mr. Zawadzki stated he could email it. Ms. Landes stated she hopes they are successful but live across the street and are concerned for parking if become popular. Mr. Zawadzki explained the standard requires a number of parking spaces for the employees and type business without counting street parking. This variance allows them to count that. Mr. Culp clarified this is not a variance that they are seeking but already in place. Ms. Landes added she understands but parking uptown is an issue and concerned.

Mr. Massonne made motion to close public hearing. Mr. Zell second. All present in favor.



Chairman Bockoski questioned Board if there were any questions or stipulations that needed to be considered. Mr. Massonne asked how many parking spots are going to be available, will parking be hindered due to the cooler being added on the side. Mr. Zawadzki stated it shouldn't and then used the monitor to describe where coolers will go. Estimate 12 spaces there. Mr. Reed answered measured there are 20 spaces. Chairman Bockoski questioned large delivery trucks. Mr. Reed answered off the back and box trucks. Chairman Bockoski asked time frame. Mr. Reed answered typically 6 am. Chairman Bockoski asked if fence would shield the alley. Mr. Zawadzki stated the fence would shield the coolers and dumpster area and indicated where it would be on the monitor. Mr. Massonne shared concern for parking on street. Mr. Reed stated we are carryout only so the spots would not be used for long. Mrs. Reed added when they added outdoor seating the barbershop would not be there so would not be competing for those spots. Mr. Thomas clarified that the barbershop will be moving. Mr. Reed states that should be saying we would not be adding the outdoor seating if the barbershop has not moved. Chairman Bockoski questioned if that should be a stipulation. Mr. Massonne and Mr. Zell both felt that it wasn't necessary.

Mr. Massonne made motion to approve BZA-1025-41-NC as presented. Mr. Berry second.

Whereas Article 7.5 of the Cicero/Jackson Township Zoning Ordinance states that an accessory structure shall only be placed to the rear or side of the primary structure in the "R1" district.

Alan Small 5 Forest Bay Lane, Cicero. Chairman Bockoski stated we hear often with these properties. Few questions-state what you are wanting to do. Mr. Small stated plan on a garden shed across from garage. Have talked to neighbor for a year, it is a 12x20 shed going to match the house. The neighbor's front door looks into garage, stated good idea asked for a fence to block the rest. Plan is to extend the privacy fence 12-18 feet, so he has no view of the parking from the front door. Mr. Zawadzki showed locations on the monitor. Chairman Bockoski questioned if he needed variance for that. Mr. Zawadzki stated does not, just the structure in front of primary structure, fence is legal, setbacks met. Mr. Small stated they questioned if side yard or front, determined it is front. Discussion on yard/drive locations. Chairman Bockoski asked what kind of siding is on the shed. Mr. Small stated wood siding. Board and Batten was determined to be the product. Mr. Zawadzki stated there are architectural standards in that neighborhood that require matches the house and this does. Mr. Massonne questioned the covenants were from 1970. Mr. Zawadzki stated yes and still in effect. Mr. Small stated he thought his house was built in 1979.

Mr. Zell made motion to open this docket to the public. Mr. Massonne second. All present in favor.

A Development Standards Variance Application has been submitted for property located at 32 Forest View Circle, Cicero IN, 46034 concerning Article 7.22 Architectural Standards of the Cicero/Jackson Township Zoning Ordinance to: allow an accessory structure without textured siding on all facades. Whereas Article 7.22 of the Cicero/Jackson Township Zoning Ordinance states that siding on an accessory structure shall have a textured surface on all facades.

Susan Mattox 32 Forest View Circle, Cicero. Ms. Mattox here to not put textured siding on all sides. Plan is to put steel sides up, only real view is across the street. Have spoke to both neighbors, they are ok, their view would be the short side. Used monitor to indicate location and what view the neighbors would have, it is very wooded area even in winter. Would still be a good-looking building and to be used to house boats and horse trailer. Chairman Bockoski stated the photo received looks like regular siding, is it going to be like a pole barn style. Ms. Mattox answered picture if from her computer but yes like a metal pole barn. Mr. Thomas questioned if there would be living quarters inside. Ms. Mattox answered no. Mr. Thomas stated it appears a porch on side. Ms. Mattox stated yes facing our house for aesthetic reasons. Mr. Zell questioned if water to the building. Ms. Mattox stated just electrical. Mr. Thomas questioned if living quarters inside. Ms. Mattox indicated no. Ms. Mattox stated has something similar in Elwood and how this came about, easier. Mr. Berry asked what kind of problems would it cause to add texture. Ms. Mattox stated the way it is designed, to add texture to the steel, feel it would look hokey, more aesthetically pleasing to leave as is. Got the idea because many neighbors have something similar structures. Mr. Massonne stated he should have driven through the neighborhood, questioned the HOA approval. Ms. Mattox stated they are not part of the HOA. Chairman Bockoski stated he did drive the neighborhood and that type of siding did not match what he saw other than a mini barn but something that size all had matching textured. Chairman Bockoski stated he did not feel it matched the neighborhood. He questioned the placement. Ms. Mattox stated the front is septic and it would be further back by the circle structure. Mr. Zell questioned if hidden by trees. Ms. Mattox stated yes, she could not see the neighbors. The only view is one area the rest is wooded areas. Mr. Zell stated from a street view. Ms. Mattox stated the house would hide it. Chairman Bockoski asked for street view on the monitor. Monitor was used to determine views from street. Discussion ensued. Mr. Berry clarified that it would be visible from the road. Ms. Mattox stated from the circle road and neighbor is ok with what she would see. Mr. Berry questioned color. Ms. Mattox stated the house is black and would either have building gray and paint house or paint black. Chairman Bockoski questioned lighting. Mr. Zawadzki stated would look to Board for specifics. Mr. Zell questioned when would be addressed next month. Chairman Bockoski stated he would like each member to bring a list that they would be concerned with. Mr. Culp suggested an email to Mr. Zawadzki and then he could correlate and work though with Dan. Mr. Thomas asked if he has a list. Mr. Zawadski stated he didn't want it to be about his concerns but asked for items to be specific. Mr. Zell asked regarding the Amory, didn't get a staff report. Mr. Thomas commented it is military how much leeway we have. Mr. Culp stated since it is tabled we do not want to discuss it further.
- 7. Legal Counsel's Report: Mr. Culp expressed concern for Chairman Bockoski's delivery of the Chairman's report. Unanimous agreement of concern and relief that it wasn't what anyone thought. Mr. Culp stated he may have sent to a copy of Noblesville decision of the BZA that was overturned. This was regarding Beaver quarry. Mr. Culp added in theory the court is not to redetermine facts they are to review items, did the evidence support your decision. Sent for you to understand the process. Mr. Culp stated as he understood it, they went through transcripts and testimony and anything the BZA considered.
